**Phase 3 – (October 2017 – December 2018)**

The facilitator's primary objective is to help the committee accomplish the following:

1. Learn about Southern Nevada's mobility challenges, new developments and opportunities
2. Learn about smart communities, emerging technologies and how these efforts can impact and improve mobility, accessibility, and safety in Southern Nevada
3. Obtain feedback and recommendations on how to best address and prioritize mobility solutions



## **COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES**

Due to the complexity of the issues discussed, members are asked to commit to participating in all committee meetings. The first meeting will be held on Thursday, October 12, 2017, and run bi-monthly throughout the year.

## **DOCUMENTATION**

Each of the TRAC meetings will be recorded, and meeting summaries will be produced to capture discussions and any resulting decisions. At the conclusion, TRAC will provide a final report to RTC Staff on its results and recommendations.

A quorum, defined as a simple majority of TRAC members, must be present in order to conduct business.
